Exciting opportunities and changes coming to ACPL

he Albany County Public Library is gearing up for big changes at the Laramie branch. In 2018, the community voted to approve funding for upgrades to the library, as part of the Specific Purpose Excise Tax vote. Library staff are now working on the planning and implementation of upgrades that will take place over the next two years.

ACPL plans to upgrade both the public and staff areas by shifting locations to better serve specific demographics; creating more storage and reading areas for a more cohesive and welcoming environment; and adding new furniture for comfort and convenience.

Over the summer and fall of 2021, ACPL staff received new office furniture, including desks, chairs, filing cabinets, and book carts. Staff members now have sit/stand desks and personal filing cabinets to easily move be-


tween work stations. Staff areas were shifted to better position departments, provide a more professional work area, and to create more efficient, communal work spaces.

In the public area, ACPL staff have been hard at work designing plans for shifting areas to make the library more usable for patrons. The photo of the plans included on page 2 are tentative and still may change before the upgrades take place.

One main part of the project will be to create a designated teen area with more effective space and storage. The teen area will be moved to where the library previously housed its Large Print book, audiobooks, and World Language/Spanish collections.

The new teen area will include more seating, computers, video game stations, and a "chill space"

that is designed for neurodivergent teens. The ACPL teen librarian will also have a desk in the space to work directly with patrons.

Once the teen space has been moved from the front main area of the library, the Children's Area will be expanded to provide more designated space for different age groups. The Youth Services Librarian will also move into the Children's Area to be more accessible.

There will be a new Circulation Desk installed that has a smaller footprint, creating more space in the main, central area of the library. Public computers will be centralized in a location closer to the Circulation Desk so staff can provide more prompt service to technology users.

ACPL is also working to remove older and dam-

aged items from the collection. This will allow the library to reduce the amount of shelving and open up more space for seating and gathering. Some new soft furniture will be added.

ACPL will work with a local moving business to shift shelving to make it more uniform throughout the building and to ensure accessibility. This is a large part of the project, that will require nearly every item on the shelves to be removed so shelves can be shifted.

ACPL is working on a timeline for the noted changes and is working diligently to avoid a closure during the work. However, there may be a minimal closure for the big moves. In the event this needs to happen, the library will still provide services using the bookmobile.

Friends of the Library start monthly members only sales

he Friends of the Library have started offering book sales for members each month.

In December 2021, Friends of the Library volunteers were able to start offering regular book sales, after a period without member or public sales during the pandemic.

CPL saw many of its statistics return to more regular levels in 2021, after seeing decreases in 2020 due to the pandemic. In 2021, the library's three branches – Laramie, Rock River, and Centennial – saw a lot of activity. These statistics give you a small picture of the incredible impact the ACPL has on the Albany County community.



206,150 Total Materials Checked Out in 2021

Top Circulating Items of 2021



- 70,306 juvenile materials
- 12,153 young adult materials
- 34,977 adult materials
- 2,884 Large Print materials
- 2,680 audiobooks
- 1,594 periodicals
- 4,164 other items
- 51,261 electronic checkouts on OverDrive

ACPL saw the highest number of checkouts in July with 20,937 physical and electronic items being checked out. Even ACPL's month with the lowest checkouts was well over 11,000.





Stitching the Past Together


Thursdays at 6:30 p.m. beginning April 7
