ACPL receives \$1+ million infrastructure grant

he Laramie Branch of the Albany County Public Library will receive \$1,030,136 in infrastructure grant funding for a

multi-purpose space project. The project will dramatically improve the existing multi-purpose areas at the Laramie Branch and create a new space for library and public use.

The full cost of the project is \$1,060,944. The infrastructure grant has certain expense restrictions, mostly related to technology, such as laptops, Zoom equipment, and TV screens. ACPL is seeking funding for the remaining \$30,808 needed for the project.

improving lighting and technology. AV equipment will be updated to allow public groups to use technology with minimal staff assistance. All new furniture, including more comfortable seating, will be added, and the meeting room will be incorporated into ACPL's security system.

An exciting part of the meeting room project is adding a kitchenette to address sanitation issues, related to water access and safe food preparation. A kitchenette, including a refrigerator and dishwasher will greatly improve how the room can be used and will be a popular addition for library staff and public groups.

With upgrades to the meeting room, ACPL will be able to improve the public restrooms. ACPL will upgrade to touchless features, update to provide more equitable access, and improve aesthetics.

ACPL's small conference room, located near the Children's Area, is another multi-purpose space that will be renovated during the project. The space will be updated and soundproofed to allow for private sessions, such as case-management or telehealth appointments. The room's technology is lacking and will be improved. New furniture will be added.

The third multi-purpose space included in the project will be the creation of a new area for children and families. On the east side of the Laramie Branch building, there is an exterior partially-covered patio with a concrete wall located just off the Children's Area. This is currently a dead space, unusable for pro-

grams and activities because the space does not have egress. This formally unusable space will be constructed into a usable space and incorporated into the library's Children's Area as the new ACPL Activity Center.

This portion of the project will be the most extensive, extending the roof and constructing a new closed-in room. The Activity Center will also encompass interior design to ensure that the center follows best practices for early development, inclusive design, and mental health support for young children. This will include flooring, seating, storage, and toys/ activities for the space.

The infrastructure grant provides an incredible opportunity for ACPL to professionally update two spaces and create a new public space. With these updated spaces, ACPL will be able to:

- Provide workforce development classes and resources, as well as professional development across industry sectors
- Address increased demand and requests for private rooms for phone and Zoom interviews and meetings and provide technology education
- Prioritize early education and development, while addressing child care needs in the community
- Offer needed space for mental health counseling and telehealth appointments
- Help underserved and vulnerable populations with health-monitoring needs

ACPL will work with an architect and engineer to develop plans for each space. A contractor will then be hired to start construction. The grant requires that construction begin by October 2024. All three areas must be completed by September 2026. Construction is expected to cause closures for the large meeting room and conference room and will be disruptive at certain times. However, the library is still in the planning process and does not have firm details on a construction timeline. ACPL will work to establish a clear timeline over the next few months and communicate details to the public as the project progresses.

ACPL is one of five Wyoming libraries receiving a portion of the \$12.6 million from American Rescue Plan Act funding for the Wyoming Library Multi-Purpose Community Facility Program. Thanks to the Wyoming State Library and the application committee for approving this grant project!

The Friends of the Library raise funds from memberships, book sales, online sales, and the Book Nook. Funding from the Friends of the Library is predominantly used by the ACPL to continue to grow the library's collection of books and other items.

Attend a Sale!

In 2023, the Friends of the Library made \$28,084.33 from book sales. That is a \$8,000 increase from 2022. Sales are held in the basement of Albany County Public Library. The book sale has an incredible offering of books from every genre. Books are neatly sorted and priced to allow for easy shopping. Shop Anytime Online!

The Friends of the Library Amazon storefront has nearly 2,000 materials available for sale. You can shop online at: friends.acplwy.org/shop. Items sold online are ones that would benefit from a larger sales audience and are priced to be more in line with the high quality, rarity, and interest of the item. In 2023, the Friends of the Library generated \$20,431.42 from online sales.

Shop for a Book in the Nook!

The Book Nook is a great option for shopping anytime the library is open. The Friends of the Library Book Nook is located right inside the library's front doors. The space includes a selection of popular books from different genres, as well as many children's books, music, and movies. The Book Nook is another area that generates significant income for the Friends of the Library, earning \$10,644.45 in 2023.

What Happens To Your Donations?

The Friends of the Library rely heavily on donations of gently used items from the community. When you donate to the Friends of the Library, your items go on to a great new life and support your public library.

Donations are first considered for the ACPL collection. Then, items are moved downstairs to the Friends of the Library area where volunteers sort, label, price, and shelve materials. Materials are sorted based on where each will be sold, whether it is at a book sale, online, or in the Book Nook.

Donations are accepted anytime the library is open. Accepted items are: books, audiobooks, CDs, LPs, DVDs, and Blu-Ray discs. Items that are not accepted are: VHS tapes, magazines, and yard sale items. To make a large donation, contact the Friends of the Library to make arrangements.
