

In 2024, the Friends of the Library generated \$24,255.53 from online sales.

The Book Nook is a great option for shopping anytime the library is open. The space includes a selection of popular books from different genres, as well as many children's books, music, and movies. The Book Nook is another area that generates significant income for the Friends of the Library, earning \$10,214.92 in 2024.

What Happens To Your Donations?

The Friends of the Library rely heavily on donations of gently used items from the community. When you donate to the Friends of the Library, your items go on to a great new life and support your public library.

Donations are first considered for the ACPL collection. After this determination, items are moved downstairs to the Friends of the Library area where volunteers sort, label, price, and shelve materials. Materials are sorted based on where each will be sold, whether it is at a book sale, online, or in the Book Nook.

Donations are accepted anytime the library is open. Accepted items are: books, audiobooks, CDs, LPs, DVDs, and Blu-Ray discs. Items that are not accepted are: VHS tapes, magazines, and yard sale items. To make a large donation, contact the Friends of the Library to make arrangements.

What's New Around ACPL

- There have been quite a few shifts around the library, mostly due to construction. For example, our Young Adult collection and teen area have moved to the southwest corner of the building. Grab a map at ACPL to update yourself on the changes.
- ACPL's Library of Things has expanded to include radon detection kits. These kits check out for three weeks at a time.



Infrastructure Grant – Multi-Purpose Spaces Project Update

he Laramie Branch of the Albany County Public Library is under construction! The construction phase of the infrastructure project officially kicked off in January. A lot has already happened in just two months.

The project is focused on three community-use spaces in the library. Grant funding will support a renovation of the ACPL large meeting room and the small conference room. The third part of the project is the creation of an Activity Center for children and families.

Each space will focus on enabling health, education, and job functions to improve the Albany County community. This project will allow ACPL to host more simultaneous programs, increase its partnerships in the community, and provide higher quality areas for public use.

Here's an update on how construction is progressing in each space:

Meeting Room

• The ACPL Meeting Room was the first area to go through demolition. ACPL didn't have much trouble saying goodbye to the worn carpet and dated ceiling and light fixtures. The small closets on the north side of the room have been removed to be ready to construct the new entrance to the room, a larger storage closet, and a small kitchenette.





 One exciting piece of the project for staff has been the removal of the moveable wall between the meeting room and staff offices. The moveable wall has been replaced with a permanent wall, adding extra wall space and more outlets on the staff side.



 As the rest of the construction moves forward, the Meeting Room will be used for staging and completed toward the end of the project.

Conference Room

 Work on this room will start in the next few weeks.



Activity Center

- You may have noticed a lot of work happening on the front side of the building, as well as a giant pile of dirt. This was the start of construction,
 - related to the Activity Center. The base of a new storage closet has been laid on the north side of the Activity Center.
- The construction crew is also working on prepping the roof and the cutouts for two pyramid skylights that will be installed.



Miscellaneous Extras

• An accessible ramp and handrail were installed on the south side of the building to be used as a

entrance. ACPL

- addition and add a fully accessible emergency exit after construction.
- Work on the current lobby and the public restrooms should start soon. ACPL will provide communication on any changes for patrons that may arise from this part of the project.

Other Details

- ACPL expects to use the temporary entrance until fall 2025, as it approaches the completion of construction. The temporary entrance is located behind the blue book drop on the south side of the building.
- ACPL's front parking lot is closed during construction. Patrons can park in the two south lots or on the street. There are four marked handicap parking spaces in the southwest parking lot.
- Portions of the construction project will create noise disruption in the building. ACPL will work to communicate with the public about dates where noise is expected to be high. There are also free earplugs at the entrance.

Past ACPL Foundation financial advisor – Walt Werner

ecently, a former financial advisor to the ACPL Foundation, Walt Werner, passed away.

Walt was an integral part of the ACPL Foundation's early growth. He volunteered his services as a financial advisor to the ACPL Foundation. Walt had exceptional knowledge of the stock market. His investment skills helped to more than double the size of the ACPL Foundation's holdings. Walt's assistance made it possible for the organization to hire its first executive director, Paul Heimer, in 2005.

"Simply put, the Foundation would not be where it is today without Walt," Paul Heimer, the ACPL Foundation's former executive director, said.

The ACPL Foundation sends its sympathy to Walt's family and has included his obituary as a tribute to his volunteer service to the organization.

Walter G. Werner died peacefully at his home in Ft. Collins, Colorado on Monday, February 10, 2025, with his wife Ann by his side.

There is a saying that most people know, "they don't make them like they used to" and this can certainly be said about Walter Werner. He was a man born of a time when all things were possible, and he made the most of that time.

Walt's story reads like one of an all-American hero. He was born in Detroit, Michigan to Dr. Walter I. Werner and Dr. Ly Werner, who then moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico to live and work in the pueblos. He loved the mystique and lifestyle of the west, but his life's journey would take him away from the area until later in life.

He graduated from The University of Notre Dame, served as a U.S. Navy officer (and POW) during the Korean War, was a relief pitcher for the Brooklyn Dodgers, graduated from Northwestern University Law School, was the President of the Lake Forest, Illinois School Board and had a 20-year career at the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

In 1982, Walt and Ann moved to Wyoming to fulfill his childhood dream of returning west to run a cattle ranch and tend the land for a decade. Walt continued trading stocks, was a true entrepreneur in a myriad of businesses and retired at 80 after a 10-year professorship at the University of Wyoming Business School. He then moved with Ann to Ft. Collins, Colorado.

Any man can be a father, but few who are also a "dad." Walt was a dad, mentor, and friend to so many people in his life. He was always there to listen, support and offer advice when asked. He loved telling stories of his adventures (embellishing them when possible!) and fostering the relationships he had developed throughout his life. He is missed with fondness and gratitude by his family and friends and will be remembered for the impact he made on the lives of so many people.

Walter is survived by his wife Ann and many family members.
