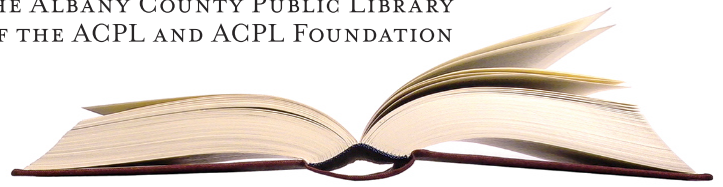

All In the Neighborhood: Summer Reading @ Your Library

All In the Neighborhood, the 2023 Summer Reading Program will run June 10–August 18. This year’s theme will focus on the Albany County Public Library’s new motto: For Community...For Connection...For Curiosity...Think ACPL.

The Summer Reading Program will have a Mister Rogers-feel, so grab your cardigan, as we have a great summer connecting with the community.

As Mister Rogers said, “Imagine what our neighborhoods would be like if each of us offered, as a matter of course, just one kind word to another person.”

The Summer Reading Program is for all ages. ACPL will provide a

reading challenge, where children, teens, and adults can reach goals over the summer. Participants will use a reading log to track their progress. You can choose your goal: 25 days, 25 hours or 25 books.

The Summer Reading Program is especially important for school-aged youth, as they often experience a lapse in learning, commonly referred to as the “summer slide.” Summer Reading Programs help motivate children and teens to keep reading, learning, and exploring while they are out of school. Participants can stop by the library on or after June 10 to get a sign-up bag.

We Live Here

Albany County Public Library has partnered with Laramie Public Art Coalition to display a unique art experience based on the stories of people living in Albany County. The “We Live Here” storytelling pay phone debuted with a celebration and panel discussion with the artists behind the project in May.

The idea behind the project came from local artist, Meg Thompson. Thompson worked with landscape artist, Linda Lillegraven, and Wyoming Public Radio’s, Melodie Edwards and Ivy Engel. Thompson and Lillegraven focused on the visuals for the project, while Edwards and Engel gathered and produced the stories.

“We Live Here” combines local oral stories with images of Albany County. These are combined in an art experience representing seven stories. Images and stories are included in a book, and participants can listen to each storyteller’s experience by using an

old pay phone. The pay phone for stories is located in the center of the public library near the front desk.

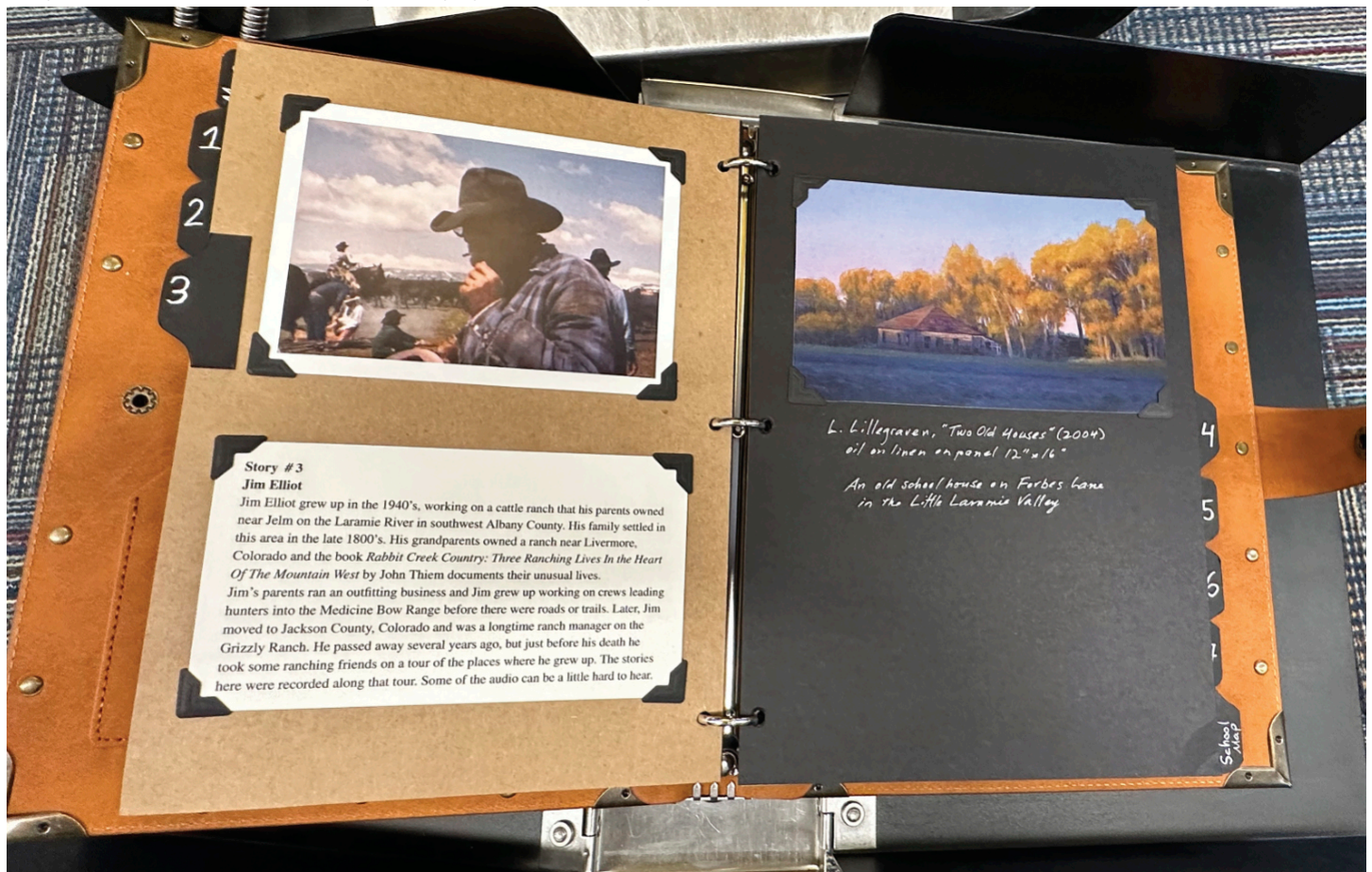
Thompson believes that objects have energy and power and in the digital age we have lost some of that. Phones were such a lifeline of the past, so the experience brings the phone back to life with the familiar old static sound.

The creative team wanted to give a small picture of the unique and diverse experiences in Albany County. There are so many everyday heroes, but our culture puts less focus on these people, Thompson said, who is motivated by everyday stories. Storytelling is particularly rich in Albany County.

“We didn’t have to look far to find great stories,” Thompson said.

The group also wanted to explore stories related to the agricultural and rural life of Albany County. Lillegraven’s painting of a school bus out in the county inspired this type of story.

Story #3 in the book is Jim Elliot, accompanied by a photo of Linda Lillegraven’s “Two Old Houses.”

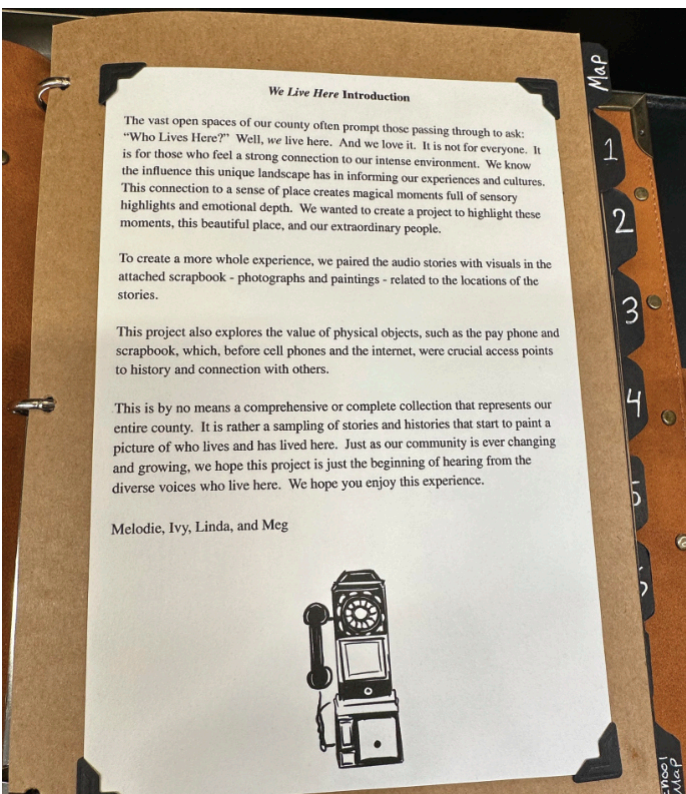
“There is a history in our landscape that shows up if you look for it,” Lillegraven said.

One story in the book is Mario Flores, who grew up in West Laramie. Edwards worked with Flores on his story and found herself intrigued by the stories shared that took place in his grandfather’s house. In true Laramie and small-town fashion, Edwards and Flores later discovered that Edwards’ family now lives in the same house once owned by Flores’ grandfather.

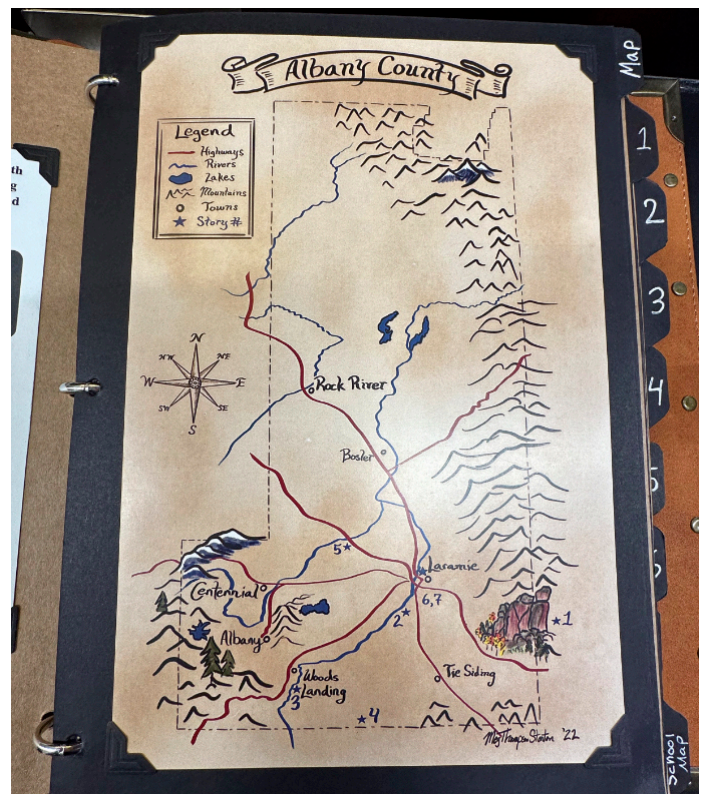
“The project showed the layers and layers of community and history being passed down,” Edwards said.

“We Live Here” will be displayed at ACPL for the next year. Stop by the library and pull up a chair to listen to amazing stories from your own community. The project was possible thanks to Laramie Public Art Coalition and a grant from the Wyoming Arts Council. 🌈
