The mission of the Albany County Public Library Foundation is to generate funds through gifts, endowments, memorials and special programs in order to improve the Albany County Public Library in perpetuity through specific programs, direct financial assistance and community outreach.



Celebrating 40 years of service with \$40,000 in support



Dear library community,

In 2018, the Albany County Public Library Foundation hit a major milestone. The organization has existed for 40 years as a public charity. We are celebrating this momentous occasion by honoring the community, and the people, that have made Albany County Public Library a priority. It is humbling to think of the thousands of donations and countless volunteer hours that have allowed the ACPL Foundation to grow and make such a difference to our public library.

As a new non-profit in 1979, the ACPL Foundation's only account held \$1,215 for the sole purpose of supporting the construction of the new library building. At the end of FY18, the ACPL Foundation now has more than one account and its total assets equal a tremendous \$2,082,218.31. Another accomplishment during the last few years was the ability to hire a full-time executive director to assist in fulfilling the ACPL Foundation's goal of helping the library.

Another big change for the ACPL Foundation, just since 2012, was the ability to start providing a minimum of \$60,000 to the library in an annual disbursement. This is largely because of donors like you. Your consistent funding allows us to do more for your library. Because of your generosity, the ACPL Foundation provided more than \$73,000 in support in FY18.

A large portion of this funding, at \$55,000, went toward library programming, materials, building maintenance, technology, continuing education, and library supplies. Other funding supported the Maurice Sendak Memorial Exhibition, End of Summer Reading Bash, the Janet Shively Memorial Garden, and designated purposes.

There is so much to celebrate this year, but here are just a few other accomplishments in FY18:

- Collaborated with local artist, Diana Baumbach, to create an art installation in the adult non-fiction area of the library (see the mural on pg. 4).
- Received \$32,000 in grant funding from the Guthrie Family Foundation, Laramie Rivers Conservation District, Rocky Mountain Power Foundation, Wells Fargo Foundation, and Wyoming Community Foundation.
- For the first year since its inception in 2000, the ACPL Foundation will provide money for children's materials from the Colleen Asplund Fund. In FY18, the Asplund fund reached \$10,000 making it eligible to disburse funds.

The library's future relies on your continued support. In 2018, join us in celebrating our 40th anniversary by contributing to our "Celebrating 40 Years With \$40,000 in Support" campaign. To date, this campaign has raised more than \$11,500 from individual donors. Please consider increasing your annual donation or becoming a monthly donor to help the ACPL Foundation meet this important goal.

Thank you for being a part of our library and for your confidence in the ACPL Foundation's mission. It is you who makes this library a vibrant and relevant resource in the community.



Building Maintenance

The ACPL Foundation provides \$10,000 for building maintenance to the library each fiscal year. Our biggest project this year was providing funding for the purchase of a new exterior book/media drop at \$7,934.94. Thanks to the Rocky Mountain Power Foundation for providing grant funding for the project!





Giving Tree

The ACPL Foundation Giving Tree brought in an additional **\$720** to provide the library with needed projects and supplies. Sponsored items on the tree included story time sessions, children's program supplies, an Amazon Prime membership, and missing book replacement. Mural

Programming

The library held **more than 860 programs** in FY18 with over **18,000 attendees**. 


Technology

Your donations, along with grant funding from the Guthrie Family Foundation, allowed the library to implement needed updates to the self-checkout technology. The library's self-checks, nicknamed Rosie and Rodney, now have a new, easy-to-use interface. Technology funding in FY18, a total of \$10,000, also allowed the library to start building a new website. Watch for the new site to go live in fall 2018!

Restricted Funds

The ACPL Foundation's 10 named funds provided **\$5,309.57** to the library for specific purposes and projects. The majority of the funds assist with materials purchases. The Gwendolyn Cook Fund provided funding for all of these new cookbooks and more!





Continuing Education

The ACPL Foundation provides continuing education funds each year. This year, these funds sent **4** staff members to the Wyoming Library Association Conference and **5** staff members to the American Library Association Mid-Winter Conference. Bill Nye spoke at the ALA Mid-Winter Conference. **All** library staff participated in CPR/AED training.



Contribute to an ACPL Foundation Restricted Fund:

Each restricted fund was created to benefit a specific purpose in the library. Each year, a portion of each fund provides the library with funding for specific programs or materials.

Colleen Asplund Fund: Asplund was a former ACPL children's librarian. Interest from this fund is used for children's materials in the library.

Barbara Chatton Fund: Chatton is a longtime supporter, volunteer, and ACPL Foundation board member. Interest from this fund goes to the library for its children and young adult collections.

Gwendolyn Cook Fund: Cook was a former head of library circulation. Interest from this fund is used to purchase cookbooks, Regency Romance, and mystery books for the library.

Friends of the Book Sale Fund: Formerly the Penny Schenker Fund, this fund was set up to honor the work of the Friends of the Library Book Sale Crew. Interest from the fund is used to buy science fiction materials.

Love Family Fund: J. David and Jane Love were longtime library supporters. This fund is used for general library purposes.

Neva Miller Fund: Miller was a former ACPL children's librarian. Interest from this fund is used for children's materials in the library.

Agnes Milstead Fund: Milstead was a former library board member and library advocate. This fund is used for general library purposes.

Mary Lou Pence Fund: Interest from the fund supports the library's Wyoming Room. The Wyoming Room houses local and state historical documents, books and information.

Adele Russin Fund: Russin was a longtime library supporter and former library board member. Interest and half of the fund's annual contributions benefit the library's Large Print books, audiobooks and Play-A-Ways.

Susan Simpson Fund: Simpson served as the ACPL county librarian and continues to support the public library. Interest from this fund is used for staff training and development opportunities.
