The three new websites have a unified basic design, using colors from library logos and identifiable icons. Simply put, the new sites are clean, concise, and colorful.





# A peek at library usage

CPL recently passed the mid-way point for fiscal year 2019. From July to December 2018, the library's three branches – Laramie, Rock River, and Centennial – saw a lot of activity. These statistics give you a small picture of the incredible impact the ACPL has on the Albany County community.



## 24,836 items checked out at the library's selfcheckout machines.

# Library explores solutions to security issues


n early November, the Albany County Public Library was vandalized. Two glass entry doors were damaged, three windowpanes were destroyed, and shelving units and a trashcan were damaged. Nothing was stolen.


Unfortunately, the library had to close on a busy Saturday, interrupting the Friends of the Library's bag day during the fall book sale and cancelling an ACPL Foundation fundraiser.

The incident resulted in an outpouring of community support. While the vandalism cost the library \$2,542, financial contributions from generous donors covered all the incurred expenses.

"My staff and I were extremely touched by the generous support from the public, both financially and with kind gifts and comments," Library Director, Ruth Troyanek said.

The library has not heard an update yet from the police department but is sitting tight waiting to hear any news.





Following the vandalism incident, the Albany County Public Library Board of Directors directed administration staff to make library security a top priority.

In late November, library and ACPL Foundation staff conducted a walk-through evaluation with the Laramie Police Department. The LPD offered sound advice about improvements to consider and security measures to implement.

Following the walk-through, library administration started to develop a long-term plan to address security and safety needs at ACPL. For a first step, Troyanek and Assistant Library Director, Rachel Crocker, plan to install a security system in the spring. Troyanek and the ACPL Board of Directors are working on a security camera policy.

The library is exploring lighting improvements for the building's exterior and parking lots, as well as evaluating landscaping projects that would help with security.
